## Facilities and planning for the future

A Concept Plan was displayed at the club in 2023 to show possible development of the club facilities. It included changerooms and showers to the west of the courts; a new clubroom area; and more courts to the south. Accessing adequate funding is the key to any development. Stage 1 is estimated to cost

\$480,216, and we have submitted a grant application for about 80% of this cost to the 2025-2026 AlburyCity Community Infrastructure Fund.

The insulation of the playing area hasn't been forgotten and some options have been considered. We just need the right type of grant to become available, so we can apply.

We have managed to bring our membership back up from 265 to 280, but there's room for more! Here's an easy way to help your club – the best encouragement to join a club is definitely word-of-mouth.
